Preamble

Guru Teg Bahadur Khalsa College of Education, Dasuya assumes responsibility for the upkeep of a green campus, the implementation of environmentally friendly initiatives, and the improvement of faculty and student environmental awareness.

Objectives of the Go Green Programme

- To develop a specific policy to promote, improve, and monitor environmental practices.
- To work to ensure that all stakeholders comply with environmental laws; environmentally conscious building and lawn maintenance.
- To conduct annual green audit once a year.
- To arrange the programme this will increase the environmental responsibility among student teachers.
- To motivate the use of bicycles and carpooling
- To plant enough trees and potted plants each year and keep the campus green.

Statement

The college is constructed on an area of 10504.08 square meters. In 2005, the institution was established and built. It was renovated in 2017 and is now a three-story institutional building. The land is used to its full potential. The building is being built in accordance with the building plan that was approved by the Estate Office, Hoshiarpur. Classrooms, labs, seminar rooms, an auditorium, an administrative block, storage areas, and other

facilities can be found in the built-up area. There are lawns, parking spaces, kitchen gardens, open walking paths, and other open spaces. The college hosts a tree plantation drive on a regular basis.

Action Plan

1. The campus has enough greenery in the form of lawns, trees, and potted plants. There is a kitchen garden and fruits trees.
2. The school encourages students to use electric scooters and bicycles, as well as a culture of carpooling and scooter pooling.
3. A campus that does not use plastic is being developed.
4. Using cotton or jute bags by students is encouraged.
5. The use of steel thalis and glasses rather than plastic plates, disposable water bottles, and paper cups in the college canteen are examples of green catering practices. Organic vegetables can also be obtained from the campus's kitchen garden. Waste from the kitchen and garden can be recycled using a vermi-compost tub.
6. At various events, the institution presents saplings as gifts to guests.
7. Instead of banners, the slides are prepared and used as a backdrop. The essential banners are made so that they can be used again in the future.
8. Occasionally, specialized environmental awareness programs are held among of all 7 days Van-mahotsav is a milestone in environmental awareness. The majority of B.Ed students are taking environmental education as an elective in their IVth semester, making it a very popular choice.
9. The majority of students also choose to participate in the gardening as a work experience program during B.Ed.2ND semester.
